Visit Downtown attractions such as the Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine, the Star Spangled Banner Flag House and the Maryland Historical Society.

Star Spangled Banner Flag House: Make and take art activities for children, flag-raising ceremony at noon, and kids 15 and under are free!

Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine: Experience the daily life of the War of 1812 soldier, sailor and citizen through presentations by the Fort McHenry Guard. Dressed in replica clothing of the early Nineteenth Century, the Guard conducts drills, barracks activities, artillery and musket firing demonstrations, civilian activities, and children's programs.

Maryland Historical Society: Check out the original manuscript of the Star Spangled Banner written by Francis Scott Key.
